#### THAILAND INFO

Welcome to Your Thailand Adventure!
We are thrilled to have you join us on this incredible journey through the vibrant landscapes and rich culture of Thailand. This trip promises to be filled with unforgettable experiences, delicious Kosher cuisine, and breathtaking sights.



## **Flight Information**

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On the first day of the trip, you will be flying into Bangkok. The KWA bus will depart from the airport at 12:00 PM, so please ensure your flight arrives in Bangkok between 9:00 AM and 10:00 AM.

On the final day of your journey, you will be dropped off at Phuket Airport at 12:30 PM. We recommend booking a flight out of Phuket around 3:30 PM to allow ample time for check-in and security.

## Passports & Visas

A valid passport is required, with an expiration date at least six months beyond the conclusion of the tour or return flight. Visas are not required.

We recommend making copies of your passport and storing them separately—either in your luggage, on your phone, or with family or trusted individuals back home.



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## **Carry on Baggage**

In your hand luggage, pack items you will need immediately upon arrival. Suggested items include cameras, medications, Tefillin, your Chumash, Siddur, a change of clothes, underwear, pajamas, etc.

Please be mindful of airline regulations regarding sharp objects (e.g., scissors, knives, razors) and liquids. These items should be placed in your checked luggage, as airport security will confiscate them if found in hand luggage. Liquids in your carry-on must be in containers of 100 ml or less, packed in a clear plastic bag with a zip or adhesive closure, with a maximum total capacity of 1 litre.

Each airline has specific size and weight limits for carry-on luggage, so please review these guidelines carefully.

## **Checked in Baggage**

Please verify the weight allowance for your checked baggage, which is typically 23 kg (50 lbs) per suitcase. We recommend keeping your luggage under 20 kg (44 lbs) to allow room for any gifts or souvenirs you may purchase during the trip and because the weight allowance for internal flights is 20 kg for checked luggage and 7 kg for carry-on bags.

## <u>Insurance</u>

Travel and health insurance are essential. Please ensure that you arrange comprehensive coverage for the entire duration of your trip, from departure to return. Your policy should include both cancellation and medical coverage to protect against any unforeseen circumstances. Additionally, ensure that any pre-existing medical conditions are fully covered in your insurance plan. Ensure you have extreme sports health insurance, as activities will include kayaking, boating, and ziplining.

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## **Currency & Exchange**

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You can exchange money at street vendors or at the hotel. Ensure the bills are crisp and new, with the blue strip for a better exchange rate; \$100 bills generally yield a better rate. Current exchange rates are approximately \$10 = 330 baht and \$100 = 3,300 baht (for reference, a massage costs around 350 baht or \$10.5). While credit cards are accepted in stores, cash is necessary for markets where bargaining is common.



## Meals & Food

Breakfast and dinner will be served as sit-down meals. During breakfast, we will prepare our own lunch-to-go.

Breakfast will take place in a designated private dining room at our hotels, which allows us to bring in food items.

The Chabad Houses in Bangkok and Phuket will offer us delicious kosher meals, allowing us to sample a variety of traditional Japanese, Western, and Jewish dishes throughout the tour.

We will provide snacks during the trip; however, you may wish to bring additional energy bars to maintain your energy levels.

Please inform us of any dietary restrictions, including vegetarian preferences or allergies.

## **Water**

The water in the hotels is filtered, making it safe for washing fruits and vegetables. However, please refrain from drinking the tap water or using it to brush your teeth. We will provide bottled water throughout your stay.



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## **Medications**

Please ensure you bring all necessary medications, including regular prescription drugs and any remedies for allergies, cold symptoms, stomach upsets, headaches, etc. If you have allergies and require an Epipen, kindly bring it with you. We recommend carrying your prescriptions in case a medication is misplaced. For your convenience, it is advisable to pack your medications in your carry-on luggage.

## **Glasses**

If you wear glasses, we suggest that you bring a spare pair and your prescription in case you need to replace your glasses or lenses when we are in Japan.

## Wake-Up

It is recommended that you set your own alarms each morning. You will be given a schedule the night before. If you wish, you can order a wake-up call at reception.

## **Hotel Extra Charges**

If there is a mini-bar in your room, snacks and drinks in the mini-bar are for purchase. Free items such as water and tea will normally be on the desk or on a table. If you have utilized any hotel services, please ensure that you have settled your bill before we leave our hotels.

## Handy Items - Snacks & Special Foods

We suggest you bring small packages of tissues and hand wipes in small sealed packets, and of course, hand sanitizer. We supply snacks and you may want to bring along dried fruits, nuts, seeds, crackers, granola bars and/or some of your other favorite snacks.



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## **Shabbat**

- Rooms: We will use the services of a goy shel Shabbat to operate the elevators for us to get to the higher floors.
- Electronic Doors to your room: We recommend that you place all valuables in the safe, leaving your door closed but unlocked by taping the tongue of the lock and putting the Do Not Disturb sign on outside door handle. We can help you do this on Erev Shabbat.
- Lights: Leave whichever lights you wish to have on Shabbat. You may additionally want to bring a travel Shabbat lamp.
- Eruv: Please note that there is no eruv in Thailand.
- Tefillot: On Shabbat we will daven at Chabad.
- Candle Lighting: Tea lights will be provided.
- Shabbat Meals: Dinner and Lunch will be served at Chabad
- Coffee and Cake will be served in the hotel lobby and also will be available at Chabad.

## **Chargers & Electricity**

The electrical voltage is 220V, similar to Israel.

If you bring a power bank for your phone, ensure it is stored in your carry-on and has a capacity of less than 15,000 mAh, as indicated on the device.

## **Internet**

Our hotels offer complimentary Wi-Fi, available in all guest rooms as well as in the main areas of the hotel. We recommend buying a local SIM card. This can be arranged before arrival with the tourguide

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## **Clothing**

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Pack short-sleeve shirts, long pants, socks for temple visits (where shoes must be removed), lightweight casual attire, and clothing suitable for Shabbat. Be sure to include water shoes, a bathing suit, a light sweater, and a beach towel. Rain gear is not necessary, and sandals are appropriate.

## **More General Information**

- Hair dryers are provided in the rooms.
- Bug spray can be purchased in Thailand.
- Laundry services are available, allowing you to drop off laundry and pick it up the following day.
- Tailor-made clothing can be arranged in Bangkok and shipped to Phuket.
- Please remember to wear your name tags throughout the trip.
