WELCOME TO YOUR JAPAN TOUR

We're excited to have you join us on this unforgettable journey!

Here are a few key details to help you plan your arrival and departure:

Arrival:

On the first day of the trip, you will be flying into Tokyo. You have two airport options:

- Haneda Airport (HND): Preferred option, only 30 minutes from the hotel.
- Narita Airport (NRT): Located about 90 minutes from the hotel.

Our first group event is a welcome meeting in the hotel lobby at around 6:00 PM, so we recommend landing by 2:00 PM to allow ample time for customs and travel.

After landing, collecting your bags, and passing through customs, simply head outside and take a taxi to the hotel. The taxi process is easy and organized—you can pay by cash or credit card. You might also want to exchange some currency at the airport for convenience.

Departure:

On the last day, most flights will depart from Tokyo in the early afternoon, around 3:00-4:00 PM.

For those flying from Israel, you have two options:

1. Follow the same arrival and departure schedule as above.
2. Arrive on Sunday for more convenient flight times. If you choose this option, we can arrange an additional night at the hotel for you (at your expense).

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SHABBAT ON YOUR JAPAN TOUR: WHAT TO EXPECT

During your time in Japan, you will experience a meaningful and halachically-observant Shabbat. This special day will include traditional Shabbat meals, prayers, and Torah reading (Kriyat Hatorah) at the local Chabad.

- Room Access:

To avoid using electronic key cards on Shabbat, your group leader will arrange for your room doors to be set up in a way that allows entry without the use of key cards. You will also have access to a safe in your room for storing valuables.

- Elevator Use:

As our accommodations are on higher floors (starting from the 18th floor), our Japanese group manager will operate the elevator for you throughout Shabbat. Please note that there are no regular stairs available for use, and the emergency stairs are strictly off-limits.

On a previous tour, two participants used the emergency stairs, resulting in the entire group being asked to leave the hotel after Shabbat. In Japan, hotel policies are strictly enforced, so we must be careful to follow all rules.

- Shabbat Morning Coffee:

A coffee station will be available both at the hotel and at Chabad to ensure you can enjoy a warm drink on Shabbat morning.

We are committed to providing a comfortable and fully halachic Shabbat experience while respecting the cultural norms and regulations of our host country.
